Certificate III in Home and Community Care (CHC30308)

Course Overview

CHARLTON BROWN®'s Certificate III in Home and Community Care works toward addressing the current demand for qualified carers to maintain personal care and/or other activities of living for people in their own homes or in other community settings.

The Certificate III in Home and Community Care is a 3 month course full-time, and comprises of both in-class learning and practical experience. Essential knowledge will be assessed through written work and essential skills will be assessed through the industry placement. Students are required to complete 120 hours of practical placement in a residential or community care facility.

Upon completion of this course students are eligible to gain employment as a Care Assistant, Home Care Worker, Home Maintenance Worker, In-Home Respite Giver, Community Care Worker, Personal Care Assistant or Support Worker. Graduates can also continue their studies with the Certificate IV in Aged Care, or expand upon their knowledge with a qualification in Child Care, Disability or Community Services Work.
